NEW TO MERCERSBURG ACADEMY

- » In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, students participated in virtual learning during the spring term of the 2019-2020 school year, and Mercersburg Academy continued to assign numerical grades. In 2020-2021, students have the option to participate in virtual learning by term.
- In 2020-2021, courses are taught in a block schedule. Most students will earn six credits per term and one credit through our winter intensive, completed virtually between the fall
- and winter terms. Three-credit classes will receive two grades of record, in marking period one and marking period two; one-credit classes will receive a single grade of record.
- Beginning with the 2020-2021 school year, Mercersburg Academy has moved beyond the Advanced Placement (AP) curriculum. Transcripts may include AP courses taken prior to the 2020-2021 school year but will include newly designed courses in Advanced Studies (AS) thereafter.

SCHOOL PROFILE

- » Founded in 1893; a coeducational boarding and day school enrolling students in grades 9-12 and offering a postgraduate year.
- 446 students from 27 states and the District of Columbia and 39 nations;
 33 percent of domestic students identify as students of color; 50 percent of students receive financial aid.
- 3 4:1 student-to-faculty ratio; average class size of 10 students.
- 3 100 percent of graduates attend a four-year college or university.
- » Accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

- » As of 2020-2021, students will earn 18-19 credits per year; most will earn six credits per term and one credit through our winter intensive. Prior to 2020-2021, students were limited to a 17-credit course load in grades 9 and 10, and a 15-credit course load in grades 11 and 12.
- » Advanced Studies represents the highest level of rigor in all academic disciplines. Some courses in Advanced Studies are designed to prepare students for an Advanced Placement test.
- » Successful completion of a capstone experience (MAPS or Springboard) is a graduation requirement for all seniors.
- » MAPS is a selective two-year program that requires a significant international travel experience, language study through level IV or beyond, advanced coursework in at least four core disciplines, and a commitment to community service. MAPS culminates in the completion and defense of a 25- to 30-page thesis and a 10- to 15-page actionable proposal based upon the thesis.
- Springboard courses are designed using the Challenge-Based Learning model. Each course culminates in studentdesigned projects that are publishable, permanent, or viewed by the public.
